- Hand-Painted PMMA Rigid Lenses








Case #1: 45yo Indian female

- Ocular history OD:
 - Corneal graft and IOL exchange 2' to MVA in 2000
 - Second graft and IOL dislocation in 2012 2' to fall
 - Generalized corneal opacification with increased scleral injection since injury in 2012
 - No usable vision remaining
 - Enucleation recommended to pt, but declined
 - Bouts of increased IOP OD since 2000, treated with Diamox PRN
- Ocular history OS: unremarkable
- *Pt is a *never* contact lens wearer



Case #2 48yo African-American female

- Presents for a consult to improve cosmesis of her left eye
 - Patient also reports extreme light sensitivity since trauma to OS
 - Previously a singer, but no longer "goes out" due to severe discomfort with appearance
 - Referred by outside provider for consultation
- Occupation: None, disabled
- Avocation: Singing, children
- Allergies: NKDA
 - BRCLA

- Ocular history OD: unremarkable
- Ocular history OS:
 - Retinal detachment with 2 subsequent surgical repairs (including scleral buckle)
 - Corneal graft (x5) and IOL exchange 2' complications from retinal surgeries
 - Corneal opacification and increased scleral injection since surgeries
 - Bouts of increased IOP and extreme pain
 - No usable vision
- *Pt is a *former* soft contact lens wearer



Take-Aways

- Prosthetic ocular devices are routinely used to keep the socket tissues in good health, as well
 - Atrophy of socket tissues
 - Infections
 - Mechanical irritation
 - Dryness
- Both cases highlight the importance of addressing cosmesis
 - This is MORE than just skin-deep
- Psychological impact of ocular loss of deformity can be addressed with a properly-fitting prosthetic device
